



Congratulations on being accepted to provide an online poster presentation at the Royal Entomological Society's Annual Meeting, Ento24, taking place this September. Your poster will be added as a PDF on the Ento24 online hub. There is no live element to the presentation.

Below are detailed instructions for preparing your presentation.

KEY INFORMATION

- All online poster presentations must be sent to the organisers in advance, by **Monday 02 September** at the latest.
- Please also send us your **contact details** (name, email address, Twitter handle) so that we can include this on the webpage.
- All posters should be prepared as a **PORTRAIT PDF**.
- Presentations should be **one side of A4 only**.
- The font size should be **10pt minimum**.
- Please ensure the PDF is **high resolution**.
- Make sure your research aims and outcomes are clear and avoid using large sections of text.
- Your presentation will be available online during the conference week and a further 3 months for delegates to view in their own time.

SHARING CONTENT

If there is work in your presentation that you would not like to be shared, please ensure you highlight this on your poster. You can use the Do Not Tweet symbol below. If you do not note this, it is assumed this information can be shared more widely.



ACCESSIBILITY

- When preparing your presentation, please consider your graphics and text colour to make your presentation accessible and colour-blind friendly. There are plenty of resources online to ensure your presentation is visually accessible.

STUDENT PRIZE

There will be a prize for the best talk, best in-person poster and best online poster.

If you have entered your presentation for the Student Prize, judging will take place during the conference based on criteria including: visual style, scientific content, originality of research and effectiveness of communication. The winner is likely to be announced after the conference.
